

## MOTION TO RECOMMIT WITH INSTRUCTIONS

\_\_\_\_\_ moves to recommit the bill H.R. 1731 to the Committee on Homeland Security with instructions to report the same back to the House forthwith, with the following amendment:

Add at the end of the bill the following:

1 **SEC. \_\_\_\_ . PROTECTING CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE,**  
2 **AMERICAN JOBS, AND HEALTH INFORMATION**  
3 **FROM CYBERATTACKS.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subtitle C of title II of the Home-  
5 land Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 141 et seq.) is amend-  
6 ed by adding at the end the following new section:

7 **“SEC. 232. PROTECTING CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE,**  
8 **AMERICAN JOBS, AND HEALTH INFORMATION**  
9 **FROM CYBERATTACKS.**

10 “(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Homeland Se-  
11 curity shall undertake on-going risk-informed outreach, in-  
12 cluding the provision of technical assistance, to the owners  
13 and operators of at-risk critical infrastructure to promote  
14 the sharing of cyber threat indicators and defensive meas-  
15 ures (as such terms are defined in the second section 226  
16 (relating to the National Cybersecurity and Communica-

1 tions Integration Center). In carrying out this outreach,  
2 the Secretary shall prioritize the protection of at-risk Su-  
3 pervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) indus-  
4 trial control systems, which are critical to the operation  
5 of the United States economy.

6 “(b) PRIORITIZATION.—In carrying out outreach  
7 under subsection (a), the Secretary of Homeland Security  
8 shall prioritize the protection and welfare of the American  
9 people and economy and give special attention to pro-  
10 tecting the following:

11 “(1) United States critical infrastructure, in-  
12 cluding the electrical grid, nuclear power plants, oil  
13 and gas pipelines, financial services, and transpor-  
14 tation systems, from cyberattacks, as attacks on  
15 SCADA industrial control systems increased by 100  
16 percent in 2014 over the previous year.

17 “(2) The intellectual property of United States  
18 corporations, particularly the intellectual property of  
19 at-risk small and medium-sized businesses, in order  
20 to maintain United States competitiveness and job  
21 growth.

22 “(3) The privacy and property rights of at-risk  
23 Americans, including Social Security numbers, dates  
24 of birth, and employment information, and health  
25 records, insofar as the health records of more than

1       29,000,000 Americans were compromised in data  
2       breaches between 2010 and 2013, and, in 2015, the  
3       information of 80,000,000 Americans was com-  
4       promised by the attack on Anthem Health Insur-  
5       ance.”.

6       (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of contents  
7       of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 is amended by in-  
8       serting after the item relating to section 231 the following  
9       new item:

“Sec. 232. Protecting critical infrastructure, American jobs, and health infor-  
mation from cyberattacks.”.
